Welcome to all

Can I welcome back all of our parents to the Castle Hill High School community. I'd particularly like to acknowledge parents and caregivers of Year 7 students and those of students in other years who are new to the school – and there are many! It's a wonderful community and school. How lucky are we. I am hoping to be able to meet as many of you in person as possible. With the dreaded COVID however, that poses a difficulty but I live in hope that we can revert to "normal" soon enough. In any case, I will make myself available, as much as I can, to talk with you by phone or in my office, if you wish. We want to connect, solve problems and find solutions together.

Numbers

Our school has been growing exponentially for a decade, culminating this year. We have 2030 students on our books at the moment. With over 130 teaching staff, 50 support personnel (administration, technology, general assistants and teachers' aides (we now refer to them as SLSOs), this is without doubt a small country town, as I like to refer to us. Additional demountables have been installed, staffrooms have been changed and upgraded. Though, we are still awaiting the finalisation of additional student toilets but I am reliably informed that this is in the pipeline. Patience, as they say, is a virtue!

Our new teaching personnel

I am delighted to welcome our new teachers for 2021, seen below. They have been inducted and are still finding out so much - but they still have a spring in their step and are filled with enthusiasm. Some are from very far afield, including Brewarrina, many are from greater western Sydney area but all bring fresh perspective and new ideas. And that I like. This combined with our very experienced, wise people makes for a terrific mix. The staff at Castle Hill High School is magnificent. Teachers, after all, can make a difference.





Year 7 camp

356 fresh-faced Year 7 students went off to The Aussie Bush Camp at Tea Gardens on Wednesday 3 February and will return on Friday 5 February. I made a flying visit on Wednesday afternoon and can report that the activities provided by the camp were amazing. They were not for the faint-hearted! High ropes, high swings, enormous poles for climbing, harnesses the like you would see on the stunt crew of a film set, mud crawls... the list goes on. This camp was about challenge, risk, resilience, confidence, moving out of your comfort zone, embracing fears. I have always said that this is such an important part of all of our growth – to be stretched and challenged in a safe, caring environment. Students had a ball – and so too did teachers. To see Mr Jenkins on the high swing was a sight to behold! Students also had the chance to connect with their year group, meet teachers in a social setting, immerse themselves in the school's culture (relationships, relationships, relationships) and find friends. I hear that the food was pretty good too. I think parents will encounter some weary return - travellers on Friday afternoon.

2020 Higher School Certificate results

Once again, I am proud to report that our academic work, as evidenced in our HSC results, is very pleasing. We expect to do well, as we should. But we want to improve always and learn more, no matter what we achieve. Academic achievement takes pride of place in this school, for all students, in my view.

Fine and detailed analysis of results continues but the following is a snapshot of our performance:

- Forty eight (48) students gained an ATAR over 90
- Two hundred and twenty (220) bands 6s were achieved
- Five (5) students gained a band 6 in 10 units or more (known as All Rounders) Miranda Clinton, Vy Dinh, Joshua Sotomayor, Sophie Sullivan, Amelia Wheeler
- Josh Sotomayor was dux with an impressive 99.2.
- The following students gained a place in the **top ten in the state (known as Top Achievers**): Kyah Bedano (Business Studies), Nathan Csizmadia (Hungarian Continuers), Shahn Raza (English Standard), Joshua Sotomayor (Engineering Studies), Sophie Sullivan (English Extension 1)
- The following courses had a **mean of 1.0 or greater compared with the state**: Ancient History, Biology, Business Studies, Community and Family Studies, Design and Technology, Drama, Engineering Studies, English Standard 2, English Advanced, EALD, English Extension 1, French Beginners, Industrial Technology, Investigating Science, Japanese Beginners, Japanese Continuers, Legal Studies, Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics Advanced, PDHPE, Society and Culture, Software Design and Development, Textiles, Visual Arts
- The following courses had a **mean of 2.0 or greater compared with the state**: Ancient History, Business Studies, Community and Family Studies, Design and Technology, Engineering Studies, English Standard 2, English Advanced, EALD, English Extension 1, French Beginners, Industrial Technology, Investigating Science, Japanese Beginners, Japanese Continuers, Legal Studies, Mathematics Standard 2, Mathematics Advanced, PDHPE, Society and Culture, Software Design and Development, Textiles, Visual Arts
- The following courses had a **mean of 5.0 or greater compared with the state**: Business Studies, Community and Family Studies, Design and Technology, EALD, French Beginners, Investigating Science, Japanese Beginners, Legal Studies, Mathematics Standard 2, Society and Culture, Software Design and Development, Textiles
- Courses that were above the state in band 6: Ancient History, Biology, Business Studies, Community and Family Studies, Design and Technology, Drama, Engineering Studies, English Standard 2, English Advanced, EALD, English Extension 1, French Extension, Industrial Technology, Information Processes and Technology, Japanese Beginners, Legal Studies, Mathematics Standard 2, Modern History, Music 1, Society and Culture, Software Design and Development, Textiles, Visual Arts

We are determined to reflect the community's aspiration to maintain high academic standards, to learn and improve and this will be reflected in the Strategic Plan for 2021 – 2024 which will be finalised by the end of term 1.

COVID restrictions:

Once again, we need to adjust to a COVID environment – as does everyone in their daily work and rituals. While it is frustrating, it is important. Australia can hold its head high with the containment of the virus so far compared with the drastic circumstances in the UK, USA and Europe. We will come out of this if we hold the line.

So, as a result of continuing restrictions the following events, regrettably, have been modified:

• The High Achievers Assembly, to celebrate achievements of 2020 HSC students scheduled for Tuesday 2 February was cancelled, instead a presentation will be given to the current Year 12 students (2021) identifying the 2020 High Achievers with a recorded speech from Josh Sotomayor (dux) and myself. That will appear on our homepage. More information will come on this soon.

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- The Swimming Carnival, scheduled for Monday 15 February, will be for competitors only
- The Meet the Teacher Evening for Year 7 parents scheduled for Wednesday 17 February cannot proceed, regrettably. This would have been an opportunity to casually chat, "put a face to a teacher" and build relationships. We will have a parent/teacher evening in Term 2 and we hope that this will go ahead, even if it is a different format
- The SRC induction ceremony scheduled for Monday 22 February will go ahead but will be livestreamed for parents
